Bodum Thermal Cups

Continuing from last months new brightly coloured Bodum range, we have introduced the Thermal Canteen Cups which come in white ceramic with silicone bands around the middle in colours to match the cafetieres, toaster and kettles.

At just £12.99 for a set of two, these are excellent value thermal mugs which look pretty cool too.

Filter Coffee Machines

Filter coffee machines have been around for years. A simple way to make a good cup of coffee; the technology is based but the results are excellent.

So what tells filter machines apart? Why do they vary in price from under £20 to over £100?

The answer, is clever little features. Take our base model DeLonghi filter machine at £19.99. You put in ground coffee, add water and switch it on. So simple, even I have one at home! Make sure you are using a good quality, coarsely ground coffee and around 7g (or one coffee scoop) per mug/cup, and by cup I mean your drinkable cup sizes, not the oddly marked system filter & cafetieres use.



Sitting in the middle, is the reasonably priced Prestige model. At £39.99, the Prestige comes with a chrome fronted finish, a digital display and a timer. So, if you add the coffee and water the night before, you can set the Prestige to switch on automatically giving you a pot of freshly brewed coffee as you wake.

Finally, at the top end of the collection is the Cuisinart (from £139.00). This beast comes not only with a brushed steel casing, a brushed steel thermal jug and timer functions but it also has a built-in grinder so it will grind the beans fresh for every pot you make.
